Stakeholder involvement

- Involvement of stakeholders in ERA-NETs and its' funded research projects is of utmost importance for the relevance and impact of a project/network.
- A first step in involving stakeholders is the identification of these stakeholders

Stakeholder engagement goals	To provide balanced, objective, accurate and consistent information to assist stakeholders to understand the problem, alternatives, opportunities and/or solutions.	To obtain feedback from stakeholders on analysis, alternatives and/ or outcomes.	To work directly with stakeholders throughout the process to ensure that their concerns and needs are consistently understood and considered.	To partner with the stakeholder including the development of alternatives, making decisions and the identification of preferred solutions.
Promise to stakeholders	We will keep you informed.	We will keep you informed, listen to and acknowledge concerns and aspirations, and provide feedback on how stakeholder input influenced the outcome.	We will work with you to ensure that your concerns and aspirations are directly reflected in the alternatives developed and provide feedback on how stakeholder input influenced the outcome.	We will look to you for advice and innovation in formulating solutions and incorporate your advice and recommendations into the outcomes to the maximum extent possible.

Stakeholder involvement

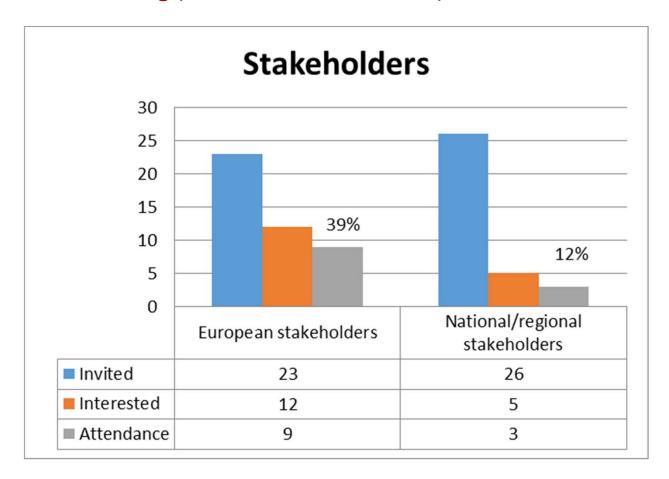
What did we do so far and ask you to do?

Interest and Attendance

- 17 answered that they were interested (35%)
- Only 12 are attending (25% of the total invited)
